Are you interested in being a Certified Peer Support Specialist or Certified Recovery Specialist?

Certified Peer Specialist (CPS)

A CPS is a person who is living their own mental health recovery journey and is willing to openly share their experiences, strength, and hope with others.

Requirements:

- Self-identify as an individual who has received or is receiving mental health services
- ♦ 18 years of age or older
- ♦ High School Diploma or GED
- Maintained at least 12 months of paid or volunteer work experience OR obtained at least 24 credit hours of post-secondary education
- Completed 10 day, 76 hour Peer
 Specialist Certification Training
- * Training explores active listening, appropriate self-disclosure, documentation standards and regulations, writing progress notes and individual service plans, and other important skills essential to providing peer support.

Job Responsibilities may include:

- Assistance in identifying and building natural supports
- Finding and accessing community resources
- Involvement in meaningful community activities
- Support & encouragement for self-advocacy

Certified Recovery Specialist (CRS)

A CRS is a person who helps others work towards a meaningful recovery from substance abuse using knowledge, skills, & experience that comes from having "been there".

Requirements:

- Self-identify as an individual with a personal, lived, recovery experience for a minimum of 18 months
- Personal Attestation of lived experience
- ♦ 18 years of age or older
- ♦ High School Diploma or GED
- Completed 54 hour Certified Recovery Specialist Training
- * Training explores recovery management, education and advocacy, professional ethics, documentation standards and regulations, writing progress notes and individual service plans, and other important skills relevant to providing recovery support.

Job Responsibilities may include:

- Recovery support and mentoring in all stages of recovery and treatment
- Assistance in gaining access to needed resources in the community
- Support & encouragement in overcoming barriers
